WOODLAWN – The West Side Story

The Calvary Tabernacle Church on the corner of Albany and Dartmouth Street is now named The Liberty Church. The local administration remains the same.

O'Reilly Auto Parts is now building at the location where the Dolce Vita Restaurant existed.

Although the part of Schenectady that is bounded by State Street, running from Route 7 to Fehr Avenue and Watt Street, is considered to be part of Woodlawn (Western), our police coverage and garbage collection schedule is different. Residents in this part of Woodlawn, would need to call central police dispatch for assistance – not the Woodlawn on-duty officers listed in this newsletter. **(Non-Emergency: 518-630-0911, Emergency: 911)**

I've been hearing complaints from people living near businesses that are open late night and 24 hours about excessive after hours noise. Surprisingly, these complaints were not associated with our bar businesses.

During the past several years, I've been pleasantly surprised and happy regarding the Western Woodlawn distressed properties that have been restored to become very nice dwellings. However, additional distressed properties still exist. It's terrible how one blighted property can make a beautiful surrounding neighborhood look bad. One such property is near me. For some reason, it took an excessive amount of time, seems like over a year, for the bank to evict the property owner for non-payment. During that time, the occupant let the property go from a bad upkeep situation to terrible. Since the bank has taken control, the condition remains poor. The grass has been cut once and is now over 3 feet tall. I read in the Gazette that Schenectady is attempting to address this issue by adding a management position to oversee the problem. Just wondering if the position money would be better spent hiring more workers and fewer managers

It seems the weather has been wet and dreary more often than not, but the Preserve is lush with wildflowers, greenery and unfortunately, invasive species. Invasive species are plants, animals or organisms that negatively impact our communities, fields and forests. They can decrease our enjoyment of nature, negatively impact our wildlife, increase the cost of living and even put our health at risk. Unfortunately, world travel and trade has introduced unwanted invasive species. Shipping pallets and crates, luggage, the ballast water of boats and even people can unintentionally transport invasive plants, insects and diseases to new areas. Without knowing that they would become problematic, some species have been introduced intentionally for use in landscaping, agriculture and other purposes.

The Woodlawn Preserve has been marginally managed for many years in terms of maintaining forest health and removing invasive species. Now, with the Cooperative Agreement and monies available from the DEC we can benefit from the expertise the Albany Pine Bush Preserve has been honing over the last three decades and apply those management principles here in Schenectady. We have a Restoration Vision that was crafted by the APBP to be implemented over the next 5 years, resulting in the reintroduction of two species that used to exist here but no longer do. Both the Karner Blue Butterfly and the Frosted Elfin are included in the New York State designated list of Wildlife Species of Greatest Conservation Need. There's a lot of work to be done, but we have a plan and grant money to implement that plan. Management will aspire to maintain our forests and wetlands as free of invasive species as is practicable.

We applied for and received a small grant through PRISM (Partnership for Regional Invasive Species Management) to remove some Tier 2 invasive species in the Preserve. Invasive species are classified by their impact on the ecosystem and Tier 2 refers to a high impact species with low enough abundance and suitable treatment method available to make eradication feasible within the PRISM. We're targeting cypress spurge, yellow iris, multiflora rose, and Japanese knotweed. Removal events will be held on June 22, 8am – 11am and July 13, 10am – 12 noon. Meet at the Gifford Road entrance with work gloves and appropriate tick prevention dress. Both events will be led by Steve Young, Chief Botanist with the NYS Natural Heritage Program, so we promise you'll learn a lot.

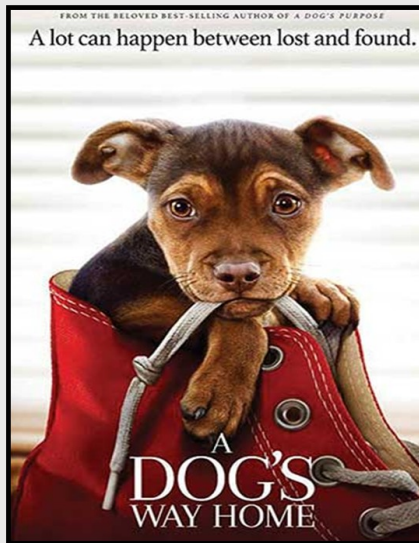

Rise to the Challenge this July: Help Address Plastic Waste Problem

As increasing populations are coming to realize the inundation of our world and our lives with single-use plastic products and packaging, many are taking action to reverse the proliferation of excessive plastics across the globe. Presently, as in a past number of years, several activist groups worldwide have designated July as a plastic-free month and are challenging all of us to restrain our utilization, purchase, and waste of single-use plastics. While the actions taken by the hundreds of millions pledging their participation in this year's Plastic-Free July will clearly reduce plastics in the environment, another key goal of the challenge is to raise *public awareness* of plastic waste concerns and encourage as many as possible to chip in to address the problem.

In order to help participants with their efforts, the Zero-Waste Chef website includes a list of **9 Tips for a Successful Plastic Free July**:

- 1. Refuse the big offenders** - refers to the Big Four: eliminate/reduce the single use of (at least) plastic version of these: plastic grocery bags, coffee & beverage cups, water, straws.
- 2. Build up your reusable arsenal** - suggestions: produce bags (to go along with grocery bags), utensils, metal containers, glass jars.
- 3. Eat real food** - If you do this, "you cut the plastic, and cut the processed food-like substances"; website has homemade versions of "many processed foods you typically buy in plastic containers and packaging."
- 4. Ask** - ask the café to fill *your* mug/cup, or one of their reusables; ask staff to put food orders in *your reusable* containers (or leftovers, if *you* don't put them in the containers yourself).
- 5. Google it when you're stumped** - "If you can't think of an alternative to a plastic item, search Google for a life hack"; gives as an example "googling homemade sunscreen."
- 6. Make your own personal care products** - website includes several homemade recipes.
- 7. Take the challenge with a friend** - "you will also enjoy - and benefit from - the support of other like-minded people."
- 8. Don't go insane** - take some action to make you feel better, but don't get too obsessed; recognize that we will take our own actions, but need and will continue to get many millions of others to participate with us.
- 9. Do your best** - "Don't beat yourself up if you fall short...You can only do your best. Just keep trying."

Enjoy the challenge of attempting to go "Plastic Free for July!"

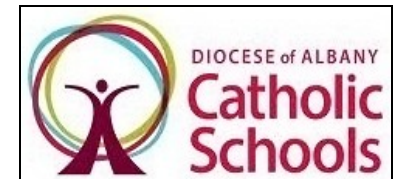

School is now out for the summer and the park will soon have a water feature back in Woodlawn! The progress on the installation of the new Splash Pad has seen more activity in recent weeks. At the time of this article, the drainage and water lines have been set in place and the foundation for the control panel has been poured. The water jets and other lines will soon be added prior to the fill and mason work for the new concrete slabs. After that, the landscaping work and new fencing will be incorporated to finish off this area of the park. **We are targeting for a launch date sometime this July!**

More good news! The Carlilian Foundation has awarded us one of its Green Space Initiative grants in the amount of \$15,000! These monies will support the ongoing work by the Splash Pad and central area of the park, incorporating new green space - grass, a tree, shrubbery, planters, seating areas and more. **To date, we have secured \$82,000** towards this entire project targeted not only for the splash pad itself, but also the incorporation of more green space and gaming/recreational and leisure amenities in the central area of the park. We anticipate sharing some more good news in the coming weeks. With the new enhancements coming to the park, it is important that we continue to receive your support. Please do your part while at the park - pick up after yourselves and if you see someone littering, ask them to use our many trash and recycling receptacles. This will be particularly important by the splash pad area where the pad will need to be clear of debris. Thank you.

Many thanks to all who came out for our Eighth Annual Garage Sale fundraiser! **We took in more than \$6,400, eclipsing last year's record!** Thank you to Mr. Mark's Tents for providing the tents at reduced cost and to Schenectady Neighborhood Watch for managing traffic coming into the park. A heartfelt thanks to our park volunteers who worked tirelessly from set up to breakdown!

Special thanks to those who came out to our Annual Planting Day. We installed a new herb planter box for community sharing. Park goers can take advantage of this new feature located near the exercise station area.

Join us for our Annual Family Movie Night at the park on Saturday, July 13th. The fun will begin at 8 pm with the feature, *A Dog's Way Home*, starting at dusk.
