



Thoughts on buying, recycling and disposing to help our environment and...to meet single-stream recycling guidelines!

Paper/Cardboard

Tours of County Waste recycling in Albany take off with a live video talk giving a regional picture of recycles, separating and trash. Statistics point to ways we all can make a difference. Of trash they receive that **could** have been diverted from the landfill, 28% is paper. How about junk mail? Buy Paper- packaged snack chips? Enjoy the pizza; then recycle the box! I f you're new to this, why not start with paper and cardboard, and branch out from there? Help someone else recycle! Unless a bin is provided, use or buy one with a lid. Apply the City's green sticker: free at City Hall's OGS, at Neighborhood Association meetings, or mornings at Grasso's Barbershop.

Metals and Plastic

You bought an aerosol-can product, and it's now empty. Please double-check that it's empty before recycling. Clean and rinse aluminum foil and containers.

If you have an aluminum pot that no longer serves its purpose, note that it is not on the curbside pick-up list. However, Predel's on Edison will take it, along with other metal material and car batteries.

While Home Depot and Lowe's take rechargeable batteries, they join with pharmacies and large markets in recycling clean/dry plastic films and bags. Solo cups can be nested in your bin. You can also recycle your yogurt and food containers with lids attached as well.

Spring is in the air; we can already hear the birds singing in anticipation of the warmer weather. Soon we'll be hearing those spring peepers and if lucky we might see a Mourning Cloak butterfly, one of the earliest species to emerge.



The mourning cloak is one of a number of butterfly species that overwinter as adults. They spend the winter frozen in cryo-preservation in tree cavities, beneath loose tree bark or in unheated buildings. Virtually anywhere they can fit into to protect them from winter winds and keep them out of the view of birds and squirrels will do as a hibernaculum (an overwintering den).

We have received a copy of the permit needed to begin work on the long awaited mitigation project. What we may see first is the creation of a .5 acre of wetland at the edge of the existing pond. Next, wetland enhancement will occur by treating the approximately 4.31 acres of Phragmites within the pond area of the Preserve. Lastly, additional barriers and fencing will be installed along illegal ATV access points to the Woodlawn Preserve.

We have written a letter of support for a DEC grant proposal submitted by the Schenectady County Environmental Advisory Commission, working in partnership with Cornell Cooperative Extension, to get funding for an inventory of trees at-risk of invasive pest infestation within Schenectady County. Targeted trees would include hemlocks (hemlock wooly adelgid), ash (emerald ash borer), and red and white oak (oak wilt disease). The tree inventory would include GPS coordinates, and will then be followed up by an educational program to arm citizen scientists to be able to go out and identify any affected trees.

Chris Hawver (Albany Pine Bush Commission Executive Director) and I met with Senator Jim Tedisco's Director of Policy, Jonathan Pirro, on Tuesday, February 7th to urge the Senator's support of the \$50,000 'carve out' item for the Woodlawn Preserve. Last year's money will be spent on a survey of the Preserve, including all foreclosed upon properties that have been added back into the Preserve. We are hoping this year's funds can be used for trail creation and maintenance. Any monies leftover from these projects will go towards new barriers to keep the Preserve free from ATV and other motorized interferences.

We have written a grant proposal to the Schenectady County Initiative Program requesting money to help support our Third Annual Fishing Day, scheduled for June 25th, 2017. If awarded, the money will be used to purchase additional fishing equipment, tackle, nets, and bait; food for our free BBQ, promotional materials and guide maps. This year, in addition to fishing, we will be offering guided walks through the Preserve. We are looking for volunteers, especially those who have some knowledge of fishing and would be willing to offer help and assistance to our young (and some not so young) participants.
