


Anyways, with the new web site, one can:

2016 ANNUAL WOODLAWN NEIGHBORHOOD ASSOCIATION COOKOUT!



Many thanks to all who came out to make this year's cookout a great success!!

It was a really hot summer, but we had a few cool activities in the Preserve that helped us get through. June 25th was our Second Annual Fishing Day; July 10th was Invasive Species mapping led by Steve Young, Chief Botanist with the Natural Heritage Program; and August 7th Steve again led 'Learn 10...Trees'. Well, we learned more than 10 trees and some wildflowers as well. Overall, it looks like passive activity is up in the Preserve, and motorized vehicle use, although not entirely absent, is down. Good news!

We still have a few pending projects:

- The \$50,000 grant money obtained for us by Phil Steck will be going towards a survey of the Preserve, and the mayor indicated to me in a conversation that the specs went to purchasing to be drawn up and will then go out to bid. We will continue to follow up on any progress. Leftover monies will be used to strengthen the barriers to prevent motorized vehicle activity.
- 2) The mitigation project is slowly moving forward. As I write this, the consultant for the project has made contact with city attorney Carl Falatico and has been verbally reassured that the city is on board. What is needed now is a written agreement, which is being worked on, and then once the permit is in place it may be possible for the phragmites eradication to begin by October. Some of the money from this project will also be used for a barrier system; we are hoping to coordinate the two projects in this area so we have a consistent and well-designed barrier system in place.
- 3) The handicapped accessible trail from the end of the asphalt path to the deck overlooking the pond: in a conversation with the mayor, he indicated this is in the works with the department who is handling the road resurfacing. I still need to determine where we are exactly on the list. I am hoping this is done before the fall. For anyone who has the blessed ability to walk, we know how delightful the view is from the deck on a crisp fall day with the beautiful autumn colors reflected in the pond. We really want to be able to share this with those whose mobility is compromised. In 2015, the FWP commissioned and paid for a plan that was drawn up by Paul Olund, R.L.A of the Environmental Design Partnership, LLP, which the city has on file.

Steve Rice, Ph.D, professor of biology at Union College and Commissioner with the Albany Pine Bush Preserve, sought and received permission to continue his vernal pond research in the Preserve for another year.

Household Hints & Handy Tips

Helpful Hints for the Fall Season...

Handy Hint #1 - "Clear out your Gutters"

An easy one for forget! Change the direction of your ceiling fan to create an upward draft that redistributes warm air from the ceiling. Recreational & Inclusion Project Nears Completion

This year was another major turning point for Woodlawn Park. With two \$10,000 grants each from The Carlilian Foundation and The Wright Foundation and a private donation of \$15,000 from an anonymous and former Woodlawn resident who used the park as a kid, we were able to complete the resurfacing and relining of the basketball court, add new fencing and privacy screens (to include a neat graphic welcoming visitors to the park), two handicap accessible ramps and an array of exercise stations for park goers. The grant also called for the addition of a swinging bench, but the funding was used with the other work. However, the redevelopment committee will work to add this last element within the next year. The goal of this project is to complement the other redevelopment within the park with elements geared for all ages in mind. Now parents, elders, young adults and disabled can access and utilize a more inclusive Woodlawn Park while enjoying their visit to the park.

Summer Youth Program

Thank you to the Schenectady County's Youth Bureau for sponsoring another year of activities at the park for our kids. Together with the oversight of the Schenectady Boys & Girls Club staff and cooperation of the Schenectady Inner City Ministry's free lunch program, kids were offered a chance to partake in some structured fun and learning while making new friends. We appreciate all the support and time devoted to our local youth.

Minions Movie Night

The short-lived rain didn't put a hamper on things as families sat underneath the park pavilion to wait it out prior to the Minions Invasion into Woodlawn Park. The summer movie night was back at the park this year capping off one of our more popular family events in the park. Children played, enjoyed some free giveaways and ate popcorn while watching Stuart, Kevin and Bob overtake the world in dominating form. We hope to bring another movie night to the park next summer.

Map of America

The volunteers of our committee have completed another addition to the park for kids and families to enjoy. A 14' X 18' map of America was painted on the surface of the park's central gathering area. Nameplates of the 50 states were also made for youth of the summer program to learn their states.
