

How to Start Your Own Backyard Compost Pile

In the May-June edition of the "Woodlawn Connection," I discussed what compost is, how composting occurs, and why it is important. In this edition, I explore factors to consider in starting your own compost pile and what to do once you're ready to begin.

Step 1:

Would you like to compost indoors (yes, it's possible!- research vermicomposting - a.k.a. composting with worms) or outdoors? If managed properly, your pile should not emit foul odors, however you'll want to find a location for it where it won't interfere with your daily routine.

- How much space do you have for your compost pile and bucket(s) to collect food scraps and yard trimmings? You'll have to experiment to find a system to manage these. You may not be able to put all of your available materials in at once, so you'll likely need space under your kitchen sink, or in your entryway or refrigerator to store your food scraps. Be sure the buckets allow air inside, whether through holes or a lid slightly ajar.
- How much money can you invest in an enclosure or container to house your compost pile?
 This will determine whether the enclosure or container is homemade or store-bought. If you live in an area where pets and wildlife may be an issue, you'll want to cover it. Consider a welded wire cylinder bin or something similar to start.
- What size compost pile are you hoping to build? This will depend on the amount of food scraps
 and yard trimmings you produce as well as what you'd like to do with your finished compost.
 For example, if you're going to use it for your garden or landscape, you'll likely need a large
 amount. Remember: Your pile will get smaller as its materials decompose.
- What type of enclosure or container will fit your needs? These can be made of metal, wood, plastic, or a combination.
- How much time and effort can you dedicate to your pile? Remember: Composting happens
 naturally without human intervention, so if you forget to turn your pile it is not a problem, but
 if you need the compost for a specific reason, you'll want to have a larger pile and turn it more
 to speed up the decomposition process.

Step 2:

Once you have your container, I recommend starting with a layer of "browns" (carbon-rich, dry materials such as brown leaves, soiled paper, and woodchips), then a layer of "greens" (nitrogenrich, wet materials such as food scraps, grass clippings, and weeds), then another layer of "browns," and so forth. This is called "lasagna composting" and helps establish air and water movement within the pile. No matter what, you want to end with "browns" on top and keep "greens" from being exposed to the edges of the pile to minimize pest and odor potential. Remember: Do not include meat, bones, oil, or dairy. Brown layers should be about two to three times as thick as green layers at one to two inches.

Turn or mix the pile as you desire with a pitchfork, shovel, or rake. It could be daily, once a week, monthly or longer. This can range anywhere from two months to one year. Larger piles (at least one cubic yard or 3'x3'x3') turned frequently promote faster composting, as well as having a carbon to nitrogen ratio of 30:1.

To know if your compost pile has finished decomposing, it should look, smell, and feel earthy.

Tip 1: If don't have a yard or access to yard trimmings, look out for brown yard bags people put on the curb for collection. If you are going to use your finished compost to grow food however, you'll want to ensure nothing you add to your pile was treated with pesticides.

Tip 2: You can still compost in the colder months of the year; it will just decompose slower. Save "browns" from the fall if you anticipate not having enough during the winter.




