


The former Gaylord's Tap Room has closed and new people are looking to re-open it under a new name.



Like many other single-use items, the 99 percent of straws that are plastic, used once, and discarded, are not *individually* heavy or voluminous. However, plastic straws used once and strewn across the nation's surface annually total in the hundreds of billions and weigh millions of pounds. These straws have clear and lasting negative impacts on ecosystems.

Recognition of the concerns have led to widespread campaigns to "Skip a Straw."

Even when discarded properly, single-use plastic straws are seldom (if ever) accepted for recycling because of their size, shape and resin content. Even less fortunately, many single-use plastic straws end up improperly discarded as

- a significant, visible, and lasting component of litter on land, sea, and other waterways
- a threat to wildlife in the environment (especially mistaken as food, like other small plastics)



#### What you can do:

- forego straws as frequently as possible (e.g. when ordering a drink, request "No straw, please")
- if you do need to use a straw, seek alternatives, preferably reusable (e.g. steel, glass or sturdy plastic), or next seek paper straws (biodegradable); finally, ensure that any single-use straws are disposed of properly.
- ask your favorite restaurants to provide straws to customers only when they are requested.






